Uniform Service of Process by Mail

(1962 Consolidation, page 311)

It is intended that this provision be inserted in appropriate statutes and rules. Changes necessary to fit the context should be made.

- 1. In addition to any other method of service, a writ of Service by mail summons (or as the case may be) may be served upon a defendant or other person to be served by sending to him a true copy thereof (or a certified or sealed copy thereof as the case may be) by registered mail in an envelope upon which there is written "Deliver to addressee only. If not delivered within days return to (address of sender)"; and the service shall be deemed to be sufficient if the post office receipt therefor purporting to be signed by the defendant or other person to be served is produced as an exhibit to the affidavit of service which may be in the form set out in the Schedule.
- 2. A document that has been served under section 1 Day of service shall be deemed to have been served on the day of the date of the receipt that purports to be signed by the person to be served.
